## Q9 Were you aware of the content of your Institutional Disaster Plan prior to the COVID-19 pandemic?

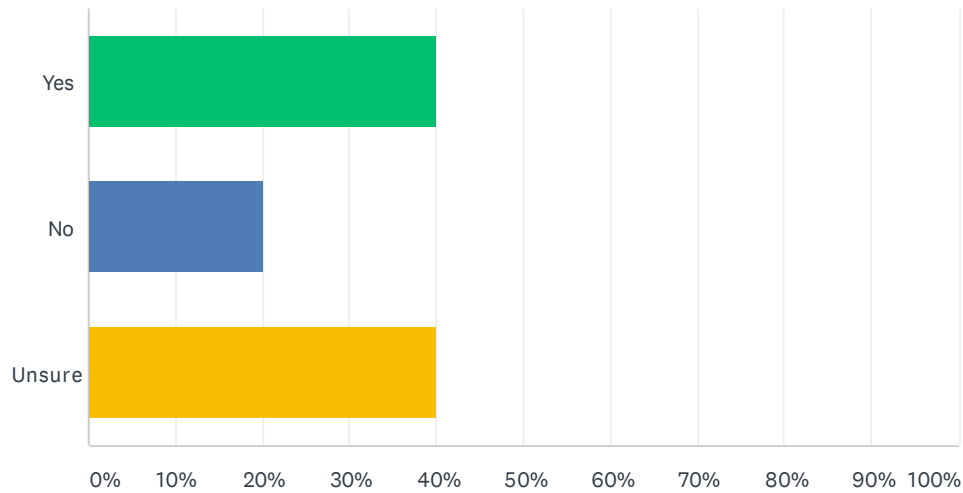

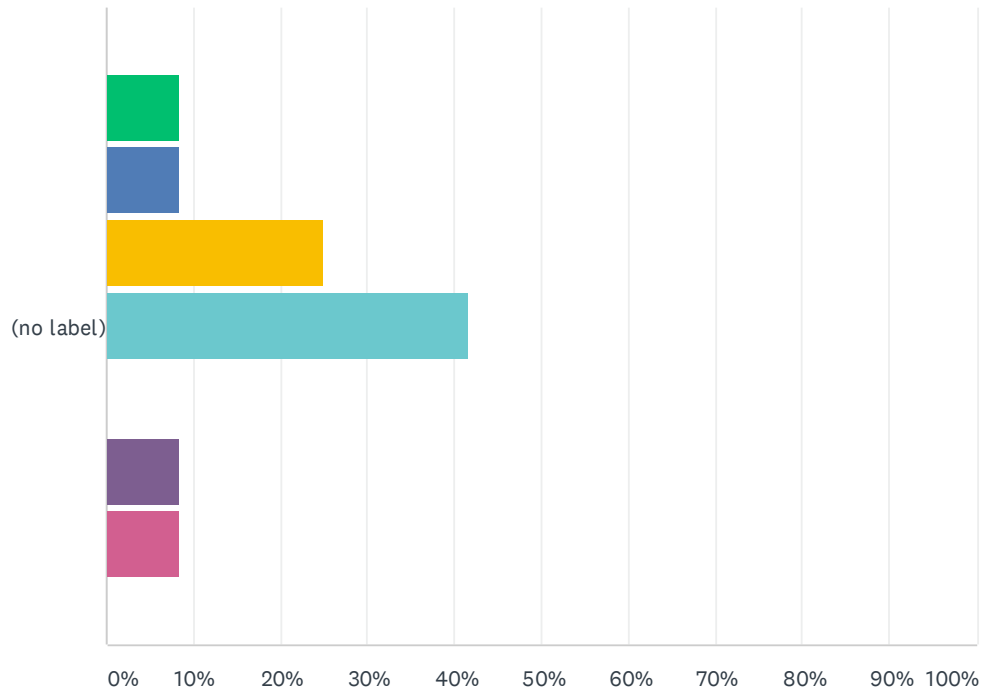

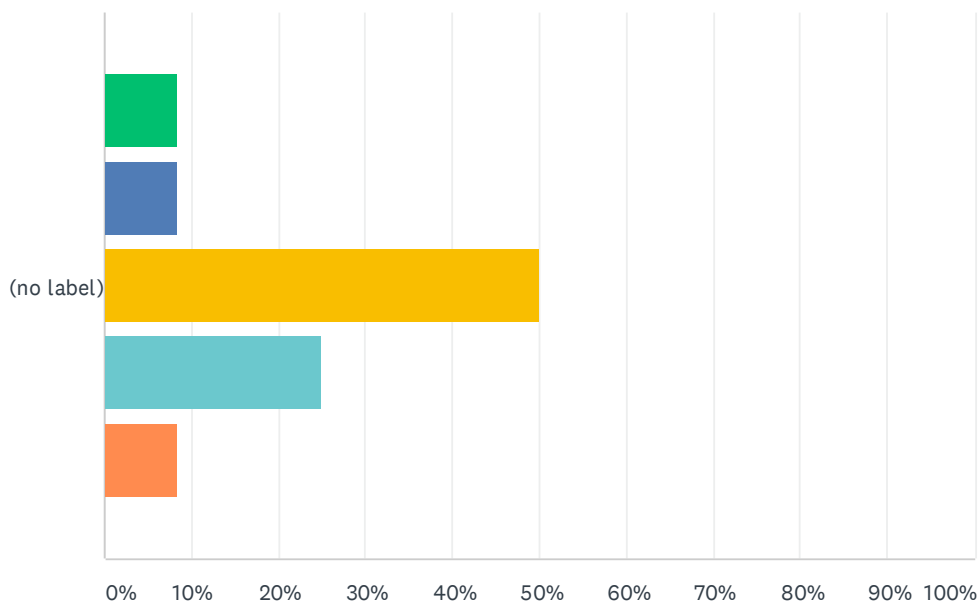
